## Introduction

AsiaSense 2007 is the third Asian Conference on Sensors. It is a meeting of scientists and engineers working in the highly dynamic field of sensors research, development and application. The previous AsiaSense conferences were held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in 2003 and 2005.

AsiaSense 2007 is organized by the Division of Analytical Sciences of the Kapisanang Kimika ng Pilipinas (Chemical Society of the Philippines) in cooperation with the University of Santo Tomas (Philippines) and the Philippine Federation of Chemistry Societies.

## Goals of the Conference

- To promote the growth of R & D work in sensors in the Asian Region
- To provide a platform for the sharing and exchange of knowledge and experience among participants coming from different parts of the world, particularly the Asia-Pacific region
- To contribute towards the strengthening of the cooperation and collaboration among scientists and engineers sharing a common interest in the field of sensor technology

## Date and Venue

The conference will be held from 5 to 7 June 2007 at the University of Santo Tomas in Manila, Philippines.

The University of Santo Tomas is the oldest University in Asia. It is hosting this conference as part of its countdown activities towards its 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2011.

## Scientific Scope

AsiaSense 2007 is an interdisciplinary forum, encompassing all aspects of sensors research, development and application. It is devoted to sensor-related areas, including:

- Sensor materials
- Sensing principles and modeling
- Sensor and actuator systems
- Optical sensors
- Chemical sensors
- Biosensors
- Sensor characterization
- Sensor application

## Programme

The conference will feature plenary and keynote lectures by invited speakers. It will also involve concurrent symposia and poster presentations on the various areas of sensors research and development.

## Language

The official language of the conference is English.

## Registration fees

The registration fee is PhP4,500.00 for local participants and US300.00 for overseas participants.

The fee entitles the participants to attendance at the scientific sessions, refreshments and lunch during the conference. Each registered participant will receive a set of conference materials including the souvenir programme and a CD containing the abstracts of the papers to be presented.

## Call for Papers

Authors are invited to submit original, unpublished papers on sensors research, development characterization and application for oral or poster presentation during the scientific programme of conference.

Oral presentations will be allotted a 20-minute period, while poster presentations will be exhibited for at least a one-day period.

An extended abstract of the paper should be submitted by electronic mail not later than February 2007 to the following address:

Abstracts sent by facsimile will not be accepted.

The submitted abstracts will be reviewed by a panel of evaluators, and the authors of accepted papers will be notified not later than 10 March 2007.

The extended abstract should be prepared according to the following guidelines,

- MS Word (.doc) written in English on 8.5" x 11" template (US Letter) with a margin of 2.5 cm (1 inch) on all sides
- Text in 12-point Times New Roman font, single spaced and justified paragraphs
- Maximum of four (4) pages, including figures and tables
- Title of the paper in boldface capital letters and centered
- Name of the author(s) centered on the line after the title, name of the presenting author in italics
